





Neoclassical Style

NEOCLASSICAL, OR "NEW" CLASSICAL ARCHITECTURE describes buildings that are inspired by the classical architecture of ancient Greece and Rome. Neoclassical homes will typically include a symmetrical overall shape, with tall columns that rise the full height of the building, and a triangular pediment above the front entry.

NEOCLASSICAL STYLE was originally the work of the Scottish architect and designer Robert Adam. The Adam style, as it became known, exemplified the return to a strictly logical use of classical architectural elements. The facade, like that of the Roman Pantheon, is formed by a porch of Corinthian columns and triangular pediment attached to the ends of the eastern arm. Neoclassical homes are usually rectangular buildings with an open portico.
